Friends

- Joel Semuels reported a record number of attendees at the Holiday Craft Fair. Jim Staton had tables and volunteers from First Church Belmont.
- The next Friends meeting will be 1/24, rather than 1/10.
- Articles are needed for the spring newsletter.
- The Friends fashion show will take place in Spring 2019.
- There will be funding for weekend programs and a weekend trip around Cambridge.
- A quilt will be raffled off at the Holiday party.

Director's Update

- There was a discussion about the problem of hoarding, particularly among seniors.
- There are currently more slots available than volunteers for the tax work off program.
- So far the number of volunteers available to do snow shoveling for seniors this winter, is down by 75%. Many seniors have specifically requested snow-blowing assistance, which is something that students are not permitted to do. Those who need help complying with the law regarding clearing sidewalks may apply for a waiver. Those who cannot afford to hire workers on their own can request student assistance as available.
- There still is no alternative for the taxis that were used for senior transportation.
- MCOA dues are now a line item in the Beech Street Center budget.
- Twenty-five people attended that RMV real ID program.
- The Beech Street Center Holiday party will be 12/11/18. The BHS jazz band will play. Appetizers will consist of fruit, cheese and crackers. The COA want the holiday party menu reconsidered due to both health and religious reasons. A motion was made, seconded, and approved unanimously. It will be sent to the Nutritional Director of the Mass Executive Office of Elder Affairs and the Director of Springwell.
- December activities at the Center will include a performance by the Belmont Community Chorus, and the screening of Toy Story.
- January activities will include a presentation, "Pets and People". A representative from Springwell is scheduled to speak, and DA, Marian Ryan will speak about winter scams.
