## **Discussion**

### **Emergency Rent Assistance Update**

- First group of 50 enrolled have received their three months of assistance
- Second group applicants are in process.
- At this point, no households have submitted documents for the rent arrearage out of the 50.
- Alert Town and others on our communication list to take down the marketing. Could instead say "Feel free to call MWCD to be put on a notification list."
- Next step: Subcommittee will meet next Wednesday to review spending and projecting funds available for the rent arrearage assistance.

### **State Housing Update**

- Housing Choice is now part of MA state law. Brief overview:
  - o Elimination of the 2/3 majority vote for certain zoning changes related to housing production
  - o Promotes Transit Oriented Development (TOD): multifamily zoning requirement for MBTA municipalities; and
  - o Doubling of available funds in the state's low-income housing tax credit to encourage affordable housing development.
  - o Abutter appeals' reform (Ch 40R): judge has option to require abutters to post a bond.
  - o Local housing authority board members. 2013 was a dedicated seat for tenant. Now a process is in place for an election to take place in housing authority and for the SB to appoint.
  - o Eviction filings will not be allowed to name minors.
  - o Affordable housing around transit, and climate resilient development.

### **Beatrice Circle 40B update**

- More than 100 people joined the ZBA meeting
- Neighbors would like Town to pursue the 1.5% of land safe harbor. The state's Housing Appeals Committee makes final decision on safe harbor. The Zoning Board has 15 days

to decide if they will pursue. There is a public comment period that closes tomorrow. Public hearing coming up too. ZBA has six months to approve or deny.

- ZBA will break up the proposal into topic categories for the hearings.
- Housing Trust should stay informed about progress and understand the decision-making process and roles.

### **2021 Planning**

- Reviewed notes from September meeting in which ideas for annual planning were raised. Discussed and provided more detail to some of these ideas. The planning is ongoing.
