The Everett C. Benton Library is located at 75 Oakley Road in Belmont, MA. The building is owned by the Town of Belmont and licensed for use as a library to the Friends of the Benton Library, Inc., a 501 (c)(3) organization.

The Friends of the Benton Library is requesting funds to do a building envelope study of the Benton Library building. We are making this request because we care about this building and we want to make sure it gets the care and attention it deserves.

Brief Description of Benefit

How does the project fulfill the General and Specific Criteria of the Community Preservation Committee Guidelines

The Benton Library building is one of the most historic buildings in Belmont. Since it is owned by the Town of Belmont, understanding the needs of the building will benefit the town.

The Benton Library building was built in 1892 to serve as a chapel for an Episcopal boys school. It is located on the former grounds of John Perkins Cushing's 1840 estate, Bellmont, which the town is named after. The building was donated to the Town of Belmont in about 1930. It served as a branch library until 2009. In 2011 the Friends of the Benton Library licensed the use of the building from the town and reopened the building as an independent library, run by volunteers and supported by donations.

Brief Description of Circumstances that meet Special Application Process Requirements

We are asking for emergency consideration for this envelope study to make sure that any care the Benton building might need will happen as soon as possible. Given that the chimney just collapsed, we feel some urgency to make sure there aren't any other hidden problems.
