Margaret Velie called the meeting to order at 7:02 PM.

## **Introductory Remarks**

Margaret Velie provided a history of the CPA in Belmont, including an explanation of how funding is derived from both a surcharge on property tax bills and from the annual State Match. Belmont receives approximately \$1 million in combined CPA revenue per year.

### **Project Eligibility**

Margaret Velie reviewed the CPA eligibility chart (attached), noting that Recreational Land is a subset of the Open Space asset category.

## **Application Process and Timeline**

The following process was communicated to the meeting attendants:

- 1) Project sponsors who are invited to move forward into the Final Application phase will be expected to give a 5 minute presentation on their proposals at the November 10, 2016 Public Meeting.
- 2) Project proposals that receive CPC support will be expected to attend supplementary committee/advisory board meetings during February/March 2017 if necessary.
  - a. Board of Selectmen
  - b. Capital Budget Committee
  - c. Warrant Committee
- 3) Sponsors will be expected to attend the League of Woman Voters Town Meeting night (late April 2017).
- 4) Town Meeting is expected to occur on May 3, 2017; during with project sponsors will present their proposals before Town Meeting members.
  - a. CPC members will be in attendance to provide additional support.
  - b. Town Meeting may vote to
    - i. approve the project
    - ii. reject the project
    - iii. approve the project at a reduced grant amount.

#### Questions

- 10 hardcopies is expected for both the Preliminary and Final Applications.
- Adjustments can be made to the proposal prior after submitting the Preliminary Application but prior to submitting the Final Applications
- Project sponsors should be speaking with the appropriate boards and commissions for

- additional support at this stage of the application process, if they have not done so already.
- The Preliminary Application is only intended to assess CPA eligibility, as opposed to whether the project is "a good fit" for the Town of Belmont.
- Some considerations for sponsors submitting Final Applications:
  - Will Town Departments be involved in the project?
    - If so, how does the CPA project fit into the overall Town goals and priorities?
  - O What will be the financial impact to the Town?
  - O Does the proposal present a focused scope of work?
  - Will ongoing maintenance be required?
- In past Town Meetings only a single session has been required in order to pass the CPA articles.
- All Town Meeting approved projects are expected to adhere to state bid laws.
