Meeting called to order at 7:35

Minutes of the 14 July 2020 ITAC meeting approved as amended.

Paul Roberts raised the issue on ITAC's recommendation on remote meetings. Glenn Wong reported that he exchanged some email with Dave Petto. Dave provided a number of questions that ITAC should be prepared to address before going to the select board:

- Who creates the Zoom link?
- Who hosts the meeting?
- Will the meeting be recorded?
- Who is responsible for the recording?
- Where will the recording be stored?
- Committee members and participants limited technical abilities (this is very real).
- Should the meeting be set up as a Zoom webinar or regular Zoom meeting?

Glenn recommends we reach out to a number of other committees that have been operating meetings on Zoom during the pandemic and get a sense of how we might recommend answers. Glenn Wong offered to contact the Warrant, Community Path, High School Building, Capital Budget committees and the Planning Board to discuss the above questions and will report back at our next meeting. Glenn will also ask some open ended questions about the committees' experience with remote meetings and whether they would want to continue to allow remote participation after the executive order on open meeting law expires.

Dan Ellard suggested we also consider whether we should make a recommendation that the town use Zoom for Government.
