2022 Annual Monitoring Visit Report 233 (237.02)--McLean Cemetery & Lone Tree Hill

Site Visit Summary	
Visit Date (Time):	6/7/2022 (9:28 AM for 2.89 hours)
Summary:	Parked at the Mill St parking lot and walked northern section including the meadow. Parked in the McLean Hospital Oaks parking lot and walked part of the southern section. Spoke with Tom Grimble for about 20 minutes prior to visit. 1) New Kiosk at Mill St entrance looks good. 2) It looks nice to see the grassy understory in places that the buckthorn has been mechanically removed 3) Near photopoint 4, there is a bat box that has been on the ground in the same spot for at least a year, it would be good to either put it back up (if it's still good), or remove it. 4) I've only recently become aware of Tree of Heaven (Ailanthus) as an non-native invasive plant. I noted a number of locations where this was growing on the property. A non-native invasive insect (Spotted Lanternfly) has recently been found in Massachusetts and it has the potential to harm some plants (grape vines, maple, and many others). The Ailanthus is a preferred host plant for them. 5) Noted abutter at 66 Vernon Road putting down pavers and also pea-stone that appears to be over the CR line. It is difficult to know for sure without having boundary markers installed. There is also yard waste dumping that appears within the CR that I'm assuming came from that property as well.

They have a working group for invasive removal.
