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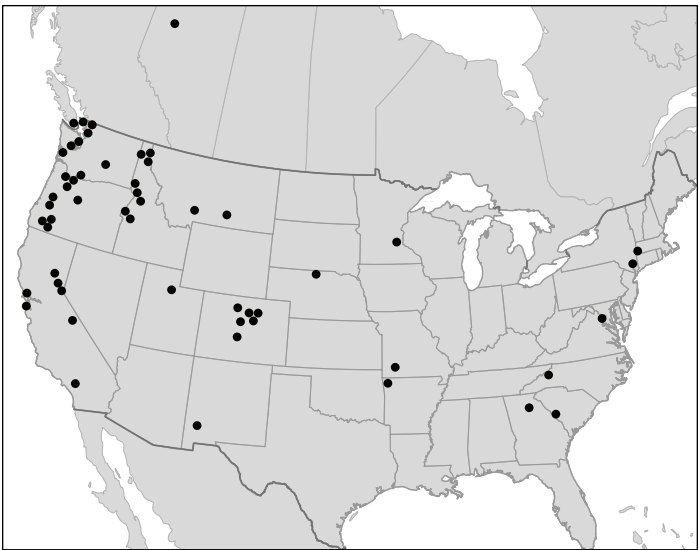

Savings from contracting vs. force account

Even for government agencies with force account crews who could perform trail work, contracting is usually less expensive and provides a better result in less time with more accountability. How? PTBA members are professionals who have the skills and the appropriate tools for the job, can do work correctly the first time, and will perform the work to project specifications. Contractors also do not require benefits, can be more efficient by camping at the jobsite in remote locations, can adjust their crew size as needed, and are generally more flexible and adaptable. All of this often adds up to significant savings over the total cost and time of force account crews.
