- An Act to Ensure Gender Parity on Public Boards and Commissions (\$2077)
- / H.3157
-) Sen. Lewis, Rep. Haddad
 - This Bill would ensure that
 - all appointments to boards and commissions of the state to be gender, racially and ethnically halanced
 - Excludes housing and boards
 - o with the mission to represent a single ethnic racial or gender group.
- An Act supporting parents running for public office (\$475)

 - o Allows for candidates running
