Belmont Town Meeting Electronic Voting

- Every Town Meeting Member has a ResponseCard with their name on the back. Only Town Meeting Members present in the auditorium may vote – no one may vote by proxy, or by asking another Town Meeting Member to vote your device.
- For any electronic votes, you will press 1, 2, or 3 on your ResponseCard.
 We will not be using any other buttons during this meeting. It is
 unnecessary to point the ResponseCard. When polling is open, push the
 button with the number that corresponds with the response you wish to
 give:

1 = In Favor / Yes 2 = Opposed / No

3 = Abstain (only available for Roll Call votes)

- Watch the screen on your ResponseCard when you vote – to confirm what vote was registered (1/A or 2/B or 3/C). The green light on your ResponseCard will blink to confirm that your vote was transmitted. The ResponseCard will only work when polling is open.
- If you pushed the wrong button, it is ok. Push the correct button before polling closes. The last button you push while polling is open is the only response that will register.
- On stage, a timer will display a countdown of 45 seconds during which polling is open. The screen will also show, by changing color, who has voted, <u>not</u> how they voted. <u>How</u> each Town Meeting Member voted will only be captured on roll call votes. Otherwise, the results are aggregated.
