- Final documents to be available in Feb 2007. 60 day review by Town
- Bid date projected for April 2007 10-12 month construction schedule
- Parking issues have been resolved

TOWN HALL REPOINTING

- Repointing of the Town Hall is complete
- Ice guards have been installed at the Homer Building
- A small amount of additional work was completed at the Town Hall and Police Station
- Police station façade repairs complete
- Small amount of punchlist work to be completed in the Spring of 2007

SUSTAINABLE BELMONT COMMITTEE

- The SBC, with the help of the PBC, would like to develop a "green" by-law that would be implemented as a design / construction goal for all future Belmont municipal buildings
- The Stanley School in Waltham MA was given as an example of relatively successful green municipal building
- Existing By-laws in Arlington, Lexington, And Cambridge will be used as a development guide
- The by-law to be written as to incorporate green design and construction when economically feasible
- By-law draft to be developed for PBC review by Jan 30 2007
