FY2024 Budget Summits

Community Updates:

Belmont Fire Department

The Belmont Fire Department was awarded a grant of \$18,979 from the MA Department of Fire Services for safety equipment. This funding will purchase and outfit each firefighter with an updated personal safety harness to provide fall protection while working from ladders and on roofs during fires or technical rescue operations. In addition, the department will update its ballistic protection with five new sets of gear to help protect firefighters/paramedics/EMTs as they work with law enforcement to rescue injured people during hostile events.

During the month of December, department staff completed training on techniques specified in "Nero's Law" that will allow our firefighters to provide aid and transport to police canines that are injured in the line of duty. Members worked with Belmont Police K-9 Barron and handler, Ofc. Taylor, as well as veterinarians from the Heal and Cushing Square Veterinary Clinics.

The BFD was also fortunate to have a commercial building in which to conduct a wide variety of realistic training scenarios. Cityside Subaru allowed our firefighters to work in a building that is slated for demolition. This enabled the Training Division to set up artificial smoke conditions and a variety of evolutions that allowed firefighters to practice search and rescue, hose line advancement as well as forcible entry and other skills.
