## Statement on Human Rights During COVID-19 Pandemic

Belmont Human Rights Commission reminds all members of the community of the human rights we all care about even in the midst of the most challenging health crisis, the COVID-19 pandemic.

The COVID-19 virus does not discriminate. It affects all of us regardless of class, race, national origin, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation, age, social and legal status, physical or mental abilities or any other way we may define ourselves.

The Commission urges all residents of Belmont to look out for one another, regardless. It is a remarkably stressful time when people are worried about their exposure to the virus, their mental and physical health, their loved ones, managing responsibilities day-to-day, and their livelihoods. At this time, it is important to avoid blaming or scapegoating groups of people for the situation we find ourselves in. Both children and adults have been and continue to be targets. The rhetoric of calling it the "Chinese virus" has legitimized this targeting for some.

We all have a right to be safe and secure during these uncertain times, and always.
