

A "Recycling Sticker", available for purchase at various locations, is required to be affixed to each Appliance, Computer Monitor, or Television prior to pick up. For locations selling stickers and more information, call the Highway Division Office, (617) 993-2680.

Items such as washing machines, clothes dryers, water heaters, stoves, freezers, refrigerators, dish washers, microwave ovens, air conditioners, snow blowers, lawnmowers, computer monitors, lap tops

& TVs are collected curbside and recycled on TUESDAYS only by appointment. Call (617) 993-2680 by 11AM on FRIDAY to schedule a collection for the next available TUESDAY.
