ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.)

One of the few early 19th century houses extant in Belmont - a house from the early 19th century, a 3-bay, 2-story rural dwelling that is simple in character and displays a fanlight (now filled) over the side door. The window openings are spacious and there is an attentuation to the entire mass. The attached structures on the east and west were built approximately the same time - west later.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.)

The 1807 opening of the Concord Turnpike created a direct link with Cambridge and Boston running east/west from Cambridge across Pequosett Plain and directly over Highlands to Beaver Brook. This house was built shortly after the turnpike opened, and around 1875 it was owned by W. E. Homer and connected with the Highland Stock Farm and the Atkins estate.
