Context of Configuration K-12

- Space, enrollment, and the operational needs of the district – short term and long term
- Financial costs to the Town and district short term and long term
- Timeline of needs and solutions for district challenges

Belmont Public Schools Visioning Work

December 19, 2016 and January 4, 2017 - Two days of Educator Planning (20 BPS Educators)

April 3, 2017 - One day of Educator Visioning (31 BPS Educators)

May 4-5, 2017 - Two days of Community Members, Students and Educator Visioning

(44 students, educators and parents)

September 2017 – Two days of Vision with Community

(68 students, educators and parents)

- After discussions, visioning sessions, and informal surveys community members and staff here are their thoughts and opinions.....


Grade Configuration Preferences



- Visioning Workshop, May 4-5
 - \circ 7-12 \rightarrow 26 votes
 - \circ 8-12 \rightarrow 4 votes
 - \circ 9-12 \rightarrow 0 votes
 - o *3* abstentions
- Visioning Workshop, September 19-20
 - \circ 7-12 \rightarrow 58 votes
 - \circ 8-12 \rightarrow 2 votes
 - \circ 9-12 \rightarrow 6 votes
- Leadership Council, November 9
 - o 7-12 → 20 votes
 - o 8-12 → 1 vote
 - \circ 9-12 \rightarrow 0 votes

Educator Survey Results on Preferred Choice 168 Responses





- Option 1: K-4 5-8 9-12
- Option 2: K-4 − 5-7 − 8-12 (grade 8 in one section of the building, grades 9-12 in another)
- Option 3: K-4 5-7 8-12 (grades 8-9 in one section of the building, grades 10-12 in another)
- Option 4: K-3 4-6 7-12 (grades 7-8 in one section of the building, grades 9-12 in another)
- Option 5: K-3 4-6 7-12 (grades 7-9 in one section of the building, grades 10-12 in another)

BHSBC/ MSBA: Grade Configurations

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After many community meetings and School Committee meetings on the subject and the following visioning meetings with parents, students and staff:

- ✓ December 19, 2016 and January 4, 2017 Two days of Educator Planning
 (20 BPS Educators)
- ✓ April 3, 2017 1day of Educator Visioning (31 BPS Educators)
- ✓ May 4-5, 2017 2 days of Community Members, Students and Educator Visioning (44 students, educators and parents)
- ✓ September 2017 Two days of Vision with Community (68 students, educators and parents)
- ✓ October 2017 Belmont Public School Leadership Council
- At this point in time the preferred configuration has consistently been grades 7-12.

What Did the Research Say

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 The research has been scarce on the subject and does not fully match up with the circumstances in Belmont.

 However, there are themes that we took from the research data that we feel relate to our situation.

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- "In Connecticut, 6th-grade student achievement was higher in schools that configured grade 6 with lower grade levels (K-6, K-8, etc.) versus those that placed grade 6 with secondary school levels (Howley).
- "In a study of 15 schools in Missouri with grade spans 7-12, 9-12, and 10-12, Alspaugh (2000) found that the higher grade at which a student transitions to high school the more likely the student would drop out of high school" (Wren).
- "Importantly, once student and school characteristics are considered, school grade configuration does not significantly contribute to students' academic achievement trajectories before or after the middle grade school transition" (Schwartz).
- "Despite constituting a lower-risk population along several observable dimensions, students who attend middle school in 6th grade are more than twice as likely to be disciplined relative to their counterparts in elementary school" (Cook).

"Of the studies that exist, only a few have statistically controlled variables: Most are case or correlational studies and rely on data self-reported by school districts" (Klump).

"No particular sequence of grade spans is perfect or in itself guarantees student achievement and social adjustment. With thought and effort effective practices can be implemented in a variety of grade configurations" (Paglin).



"..found few studies that used statistical procedures in an effort to yield a clearer picture of the cause-and- effect between grade-span configuration and student achievement."
