FY2024 Budget Update

On Friday, February 3rd, both the Town and School preliminary FY2024 budgets were released. At the next Budget Summit on **February 9th**, the Town Administrator and School Superintendent will present the preliminary Town and School budgets. The main policy making boards and committees – Select Board, School Committee, Warrant Committee and Capital Committee – have attended four FY2024 Budget Summits so far. Community Updates:

Belmont Fire Department

In January, the BFD welcomed firefighter recruit Nicholas Volante to the department. Recruit Volante is a Belmont native and will undergo in-house training before participating in the Boston Fire Department Training Academy in February.

The fire department also placed in service 40 new pieces of self-contained breathing apparatus (air packs). The new air packs replace units that were over 10 years old and out of compliance with current safety standards. This equipment increases the safety of our firefighters and allows them to protect the lives and property of our residents more efficiently. The department would like to thank the residents of Belmont for supporting us in this Capital Budget purchase.

The Massachusetts Department of Fire Services recently awarded the Belmont Fire Department a grant of over \$6,500 to provide Student Awareness of Fire Education (SAFE) and Senior SAFE programming in our community. This funding will allow our dedicated team of instructors to reach school-age children as well as older adults. Providing timely safety instruction and public information to those most affected by fires and other life safety emergencies aligns with the BFD goal of community risk reduction through public interaction.

The Town's insurance provider, MIIA, recently provided, at no cost, an emergency vehicle driving simulator. This traveling simulator was at Fire HQ for a week-long training session that encompassed all four work groups. Realistic simulation of emergency vehicle driving scenarios as well as classroom instruction helped Belmont Firefighters sharpen their skills in a no-risk environment.

Belmont's Annual Town Election will be held on **Tuesday**, April 4, 2023. Considering running for elected office in Belmont? The deadline to be registered to vote for Belmont's local election is 5:00pm March 24, 2023. You may register online at <u>www.voteinma.com</u>. Become an Election Worker:

Consider helping Belmont vote! We are always looking for more great people to work in our precincts on election day. Thorough training, half-day shifts, and minimum wage pay are offered. 2023 Census:

Annual Town Census forms were mailed to every household in **mid- to late-January**. Please review, update, sign, and return your form as soon as you can. This helps keep our list of residents and voters accurate.

Pet Licenses:

All cats and dogs are to be licensed by March 15th. Renewals may be done online (<u>Click here</u>), by mail, Town Clerk drop box or in the Town Clerk's Office in Town Hall. First-time pets may be licensed by mail, Town Clerk drop box or in the Town Clerk's Office in Town Hall. Applications were mailed to every household with the census form.
