Community Updates:

Belmont Fire Department

In the month of October, the Belmont Fire Department conducted numerous training exercises. All members of the department were trained in advanced fire pump operations by instructors from our apparatus dealer. We also sponsored the “Mobile Training Maze” from the Department of Fire Services. This allowed our firefighters to practice search and rescue techniques in an unfamiliar setting with obscured visibility, similar to actual conditions during a structure fire.

The most recent new service provided by the fire department addresses one of our community risk reduction goals in the form of child car safety seat inspection and installation. A number of residents have used this opportunity to have their child seats checked or installed. Belmont residents can email carseatinstallation@belmont-ma.gov, appointments are scheduled on Thursday between the hours of 1:00-4:00 pm.

Our firefighters also engaged in many public education opportunities. Members of the EMS Bike Unit along with Chief DeStefano held an informational session at the Beech Street Center to explain the benefits of early EMS intervention using bicycles at public gatherings. The department also held our first Open House since the start of the pandemic. This event featured an auto extrication demonstration, fire truck and ambulance tours, as well as an opportunity for youngsters to use a real fire hose. We thank the community for their attendance and support of this event!

The fire department also would like to thank the organizers of the “Touch a Truck” event in Belmont Center for their invitation to attend. We had a great day showing our trucks and equipment to children and adults alike! During Fire Prevention Week young people at the Belmont Library had an opportunity to see Belmont Ladder 1 up close and read stories about firefighters with Chief DeStefano. The participation was great! We always like to start our fire safety and education message to young students.



Belmont Town Clerk's Office

Early Voting for the November 8th State Election is currently underway in the Town Hall, continuing through Noon on Friday, November 4th. In addition, more than 5,600 Vote by Mail Ballots have been mailed to Belmont voters for this election; the deadline to apply is November 1st. Voting on Election Day, November 8th will take place at Belmont's eight voting precincts; polls are open from 7 AM to 8 PM.

In addition to the State, County and District offices of Governor and Lt Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Treasurer, Auditor, Representative in Congress, Councilor, Senator in General Court, Representative in General Court, District Attorney, Sheriff, there are six ballot questions. Questions 1 through 4 are Statewide ballot questions and questions 5 and 6 are local debt exclusion ballot questions. Each Belmont household was mailed with the September/October Light bill a voter information sheet and the State mailed the red booklet, “Information for Voters” describing some of the State ballot questions. Voters should be aware that the ballot is two-sided with questions 2 through 6 appearing on the back side. More voter information may be found at www.VoteInMA.com
