

March 31: Celebrating Transgender & Non-Binary People

Transgender Day of Visibility (TDOV) is an annual event dedicated to:

- celebrating transgender and nonbinary people and their achievements
- raising awareness of discrimination faced by these individuals worldwide.





Founded in 2009 by trans activist Rachel Crandall of Michigan as a reaction to the lack of LGBTQ+ recognition of transgender and non-binary people. Crandall cited the frustration that the only wellknown transgender-centered day was the Transgender Day of Remembrance, which mourned the murders of transgender people.


- ► The first International Transgender Day of Visibility was held on March 31, 2009.
- ►It has since been spearheaded by the U.S.-based youth advocacy organization Trans Student Educational Resources.






SCHUYLER BAILAR

- ► English, identifies as nonbinary and genderqueer

Pediatrician, 4-star Admiral She/Her

- ► United States Assistant Secretary of Health
- ► Attended Belmont Hill School, Harvard University, and Tulane University School of Medicine
- ► The highest ranking transgender official in our current administration

Composer, producer and video game developer *She/Her*

- ► Worked as designer and composer on video game "Minecraft"
- ► Composed music for video games including "Guild Wars 2", "Deltarune" and "Chicory: A Colorful Tale"
- ► American-Canadian



LIA THOMAS

Swimmer She/Her




- ► University of Pennsylvania student and swimmer; NCAA champion
- ➤ Swam on the men's team in 2018–2019, then transitioned, and swam on the women's team in 2021
- Courageously described her transition in a SwimSwam video interview




LAVERNE COX

Actress, LGBT advocate She/Her



- ► Famous for role as Sophia Burset in Netflix series "Orange is the New Black"
- ► Appeared on the cover of Time Magazine
- ► First transgender person to be nominated for a Primetime Emmy
- ► Has an identical twin brother





LASAIA WADE

Speaker, Writer, Organizer, Educator, Trans Liberator She/Her They/Them

- LaSaia is an Afro-Puerto Rican indigenous Trans Woman
- ➤ She founded the Tennessee Trans Journey Project (TNTJ), an organization that provides services and support to trans-identified individuals in Tennessee
- ➤ She also founded the Brave Space Alliance, which is the first Black-led, trans-led LGBTQ center located on the South Side of Chicago





CHELLA MAN

Actor, Artist, Activist He/Him

- ► American actor, model, artist, YouTuber, & LGBTQ+ activist
- ► Known for sharing his experiences as a transgender, deaf, genderqueer, & Jewish person of color
- ▶ Rose to wider prominence in 2019 for portraying mute superhero, Jericho, in the DC Universe series *Titans*
- ► Published book, Continuum





DYLAN MULVANEY

Actress, Comic, Content Creator, Influencer She/Her They/Them

- ► Dylan was recently awarded the TikTok Trailblazer award for her viral series "Days of Girlhood," which documents her transition journey
- ► In 2022, Dylan was invited to the White House to speak with President Joe Biden regarding recent attacks on transgender rights






MEG EMIKO

Artist, Activist They/Them

- ► Meg is an Asian American non-binary, transgender artist and activist who creates art and apparel that represents and advocates for QTBIPOC* and LGBTQIA+ communities
- ▶ Meg also has a TikTok account, where they focus on topics related to their art, identity and their gender affirmation journey with the aim of helping QTBIPOC* individuals feel seen, heard, and represented

- ▶ Performed as part of the LGBTQ+ Pride Celebration at Cambridge's Starlight Square in June 2021






FALLON FOX

- ► Served on USS Enterprise as operations specialist
- ► Uses Social Media to advocate for trans rights
- ► 2014 Inducted into National Gay and Lesbian Sports Hall of Fame



AKWAEKE EMEZIMultidisciplinary artist & writer *They/Them*



- ► Nigerian, Identifies as nonbinary and as ogbanje (literally "children who come and go," described as an "evil spirit"), and they experience multiplicity.
- ► Writes young adult fiction, poetry, nonfiction, short stories
- ► Works in visual arts, television, film
- ► Novels include Freshwater, PET, The Death of Vivek Ojiwon
- ► 2022 Stonewall Book Award for Nonfiction





Lawyer, Expert on Trans Rights *He/They*



- Deputy Director for Transgender Justice with the ACLU's LGBT & HIV Project
- Cofounder of Lorena Borjas
 Community Fund*
- Worked on ACLU's challenge to North Carolina bathroom bill
- Assisted on Supreme Court case (Aimee Stephens), which protected employees from being fired based on LGBTQ identity


Actor, Singer She/Her

- Starred in Juno, Whip It, many other films, and the Netflix series The Umbrella Academy






JENNIFER FINNEY BOYLAN

- Serves on Athlete Advisory Committee for U.S. Figure Skating






IMARA JONES

- Advocate for Korean Unification






AMY SCHNEIDER

- First female (transgender) baritone to perform a principal role on an American operatic stage. She played the starring role in Mozart's *Don Giovanni* with the Tulsa Opera.
- The first transgender baritone to appear with the English National Opera in London, playing Public Opinion in *Orpheus in the Underworld* at the London Coliseum

- ► American writer, performance artist, and media personality who performs under the moniker ALOK
- ► Gender non-conforming and transfeminine
- ► The child of immigrant parents from Malaysia & India
- ► Has designed three genderneutral fashion collections.
