# Minutes March 11, 2022 Meeting conducted via Zoom

Meeting was called to order at 8:37am.

#### **Minutes**

The minutes of the February 11, 2022 meetings were approved. Moved: Paolillo, Seconded: Pikcilingis, Voted: 4-0. February 18. Moved: Paolillo, Seconded: Pikclingis, Voted 3-0 (Antonellis abstained)

## **Discussion of Next Steps**

The working group agreed that we will meet at least once more to compile our ideas into text that can appear in the executive summary of the committee report.

#### **Identifying Key Themes**

The working group discussed the key themes that we've previously identified. These are:

- 1. Need for Greater Centralization and Standardization
- 2. Improved and more transparent financial planning and management
- 3. Vigilance in identifying new revenue sources
- 4. Create a plan to monetize real estate through rezoning, sale, and or lease of property
- 5. Work collaboratively with neighboring communities and centralize purchasing to improve efficiency
- 6. Implement a process to evaluate whether to outsource/insource a given service
- 7. Promote innovation among the town and district staff
- 8. Work with Belmont Light to reduce utility bills for town residents and businesses
- 9. Pension and/or Retirement Board changes

On figuring out what happens after the report is done, Paolillo highlighted the importance of identifying concrete next steps for each idea. Pikcilingis noted that there are lots of good resources from the Collins Center that could help us make progress on implementing these ideas.

In reviewing these themes, the working group noted some issues to fix. For example, "centralize purchasing to improve efficiency" should be included in theme 1 instead of 5, and number 8 should be more general (such as "Reduce costs to residents").

#### **Review of Matrix**

The working group reviewed the current matrix, adding scores for a few ideas that were missing scores or that were recently assigned to the working group. - ID 413 (Town Charter) Given a score of 47

- ID 418 (Property tax incentives for property owners who make apartments affordable) parent is now ID 107 (Review re-zoning opportunities)
- ID 419 (Commercial development along Community Path) parent is now ID 107 (Review re-zoning opportunities)
- ID 420 (School bus regionalization) parent is now 108 (Establish Town Manager/Administrator working group)

- Working group members will identify one or more themes covered in the ideas that they
  wrote up.
